It's a common misconception that women aren't appreciated in the Bible. Some cultural practices and historical circumstances did harbor a degrading and even abusive attitude toward women, but nothing could be further from the truth when it comes to how God views them.

Women were made in the image of God. Genesis 1:27 says, "So God created

man(kind) in his image, in the image of God He created... male and female He created them." Eve was not made because Adam was lonely, or unsatisfied. How could he be while in perfect Eden walking with God? God said it wasn't good for Adam to be alone because He had so much more to teach him.

Scripture tells us that Jesus is the "second"

"In Eden God was trying to instruct humanity about Him. He made a physical, human symbol of the Godhead: God the Father, Adam the son like Jesus, and

Eve the helper like the Holy Spirit."

Adam" (1 Cor. 15:45). Think about the symbolism God was creating in Eden. God the Father created Adam the son, and then He created Eve as "the helper." Where have you heard that name before? 
Vacation Bible School

All were welcomed into her home and treated with kindness and respect. She kept things going at home on the farm besides working in the laundry or kitchen at the hospital or at the restaurant at the nearby ski resort. Later she would become food service director for Sandia View Academy in Corrales, NM, where she taught her cooking skills to her student workers and treated them like her own children.

Whatever needed to be done, Mom was ready to help out, whether it was driving the logging truck for her husband's sawmill and logging business or running after parts.

She also cared for her aging mother, moving her into Mom and Dad's home, besides maintaining her own household.

Mom has always had a listening ear for those who needed someone on which to lean during frustrating or difficult times.

"She is clothed with strength and dignity, and she laughs without fear of the future.

When she speaks, her words are wise, and she gives instructions with kindness.

NEW MEMBERS




On March 19, Pastor Dustin had the joy of baptizing his youngest son, Canaan, in Corning, New York.

REMEMBERING

OUR TIME OF SERVICE IN RUSSIA AND UKRAINE




Barbara and Lee Huff in traditional Russian garb

Pastor Lee Huff served in Russia as President of the Euro-Asia Division of the Seventh-day Adventist church, and Barbara was an administrative assistant there, prior to moving to Punta Gorda. With the current war in Ukraine on our minds, we asked Barbara to share a little about their experience there, and thank her for taking the time to write for us.

It's hard to know where to start a story. It could be at the beginning, or the end, or somewhere in between. I don't really know where our story began, so I'll start in the middle.

Lee and I had been travelling several days with friends to Bulgaria, Prague and Moscow. Our final destination was Kiev, Ukraine where we were scheduled to hold evangelistic meetings in October 1991. We traveled by train for about twelve hours so had plenty of time to wonder if we were absolutely crazy. We couldn't speak a word of Russian, we had no way to contact anyone, and we didn't know who to contact anyway! It was after dark when we pulled into Kiev. The train had barely come to a stop when a young lady jumped aboard our "sleep wagon" and asked, "Lee Huff?" Anya's English was perfect. We knew we were going to be OK. While still in the railyards, she pointed out Lee's picture on posters advertising the meetings. The meetings were held in a prominent building in town; six hundred people were baptized in a large swimming pool at the close of the series. It is heart-breaking that Russia is attacking

the beautiful 1500-year-old city of Kiev.

We returned four times to hold evangelistic meetings and start new churches in four other cities of Ukraine. Incidentally, these cities are all shown on TV maps as cities under siege from Russia. The years that we held these meetings, Lee was president of the Minnesota Conference, and I was the communications director.

In 1995, General Conference President Bob Folkenberg asked us if we would be willing to move to Moscow for Lee to be president of the Euro-Asia Division of the church. He thought Lee was a good choice because he was known there and we knew the people. I would be an administrative assistant. Our stipulation was that it would only be for five years as Lee planned to retire at 65. By then a national would be groomed and ready to take over the position.

We moved to Moscow in May 1996. That means that today, in 2022, we find ourselves loving people we know in the two countries which are fighting with each other! We don't know if our churches still stand or if our people are safe.

The city of Mariupol, which has suffered such violent destruction, holds fond memories for us. Besides the church members, there is a steel mill and crystal factory. We toured both and brought home several pieces of beautiful crystal. At the time, it seemed as though the crystal factory was the only place in Russia where we had seen adequate lighting. But the women who were engraving the crystal wore no protection over their eyes!

I'm remembering something else. I remember Jesus' words in Matthew 24 that in the last days, among other things, there would be wars and famines. It looks like we are there!




