Once it was taken away from us it made me realize just how important it was in my life. As they say, you don't miss what you had until it is gone.

Given the fact that we so easily take church and our even Christianity for granted, how much erosion do you think there could have been over the years? Think about it. Can you match their information to the right person? (Check your answers on the following page.)




Set the shotput record in high school, which stood for 42 years.

## Monthly Potlucks are Back!


